5. Discussion 2018-2019 Educatius Program

Mr. Cleary introduced two current Educatius students, Ms. Marika Jungk from Germany and Ms. Laura Celli from Italy, to The Committee. Ms. Jungk and Ms. Celli spoke about their experiences in the Lynnfield Public Schools through the Educatius program.

Ms. Jungk already graduated in Germany. She spoke about:

- Chose LHS for the music and graphic design (art) opportunities
- Loves the new subjects and meeting new people
- Feels it's important to get to know english language and use everyday
- Extracurricular activities included: Cross Country, Art Club, Chorus, Drama
- Wishes she was staying all year
- Family coming to visit in the summer

Ms. Celli has another year of school to finish in Italy. Ms. Celli agreed with Ms. Jungk's comments and spoke about:

- Enjoys school and family
- Difficult at the start transitioning
- Freedom to select subjects; opportunity to learn new thing
- Teachers helpful
- Extracurricular activities included: Music and Drama

Both girls found Lynnfield people very welcoming and enjoyed learning/understanding a new culture different from what they are used to. Their favorite part of the experience has been the people. In response to The Committee inquiry regarding where they will apply for college they are both considering colleges in the United States.

Mr. Cleary then gave the historical background on Lynnfield's participation in the Educatius program including:

- Lynnfield's 5th year participating
- Average six (6) students a year
- Earlier arrival in US for students; orientation program
- Application, screening and SEVIS process and one year stay requirements for students
- Local Coordinator; Mrs. Barbara Langill
- Host families; including families who are repeat host families to students in the program
- School and community involvement eases transition
- Use of Compass Program mentors for connection/face around the school

During discussion the following were discussed:

- Full year/one semester breakdown; split only take one semester students in the fall
- Fully funded through educatius including ELL
- Good group host families
- Trend in coming to Lynnfield; all over small school, AP courses, academics, athletics, music/drama program

 - Train five staff members for ability to offer various times
