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Previous Grading:: 2020/21 school year:

March-June 2020- LHS shifted to full remote learning due to the Covid-19 pandemic. All sports, activities and standardized testing options were suspended. The grading policy was adjusted for the 4th quarter and all students received a P (pass) or NP (not passing) designation on their transcript. Final grades were calculated on 1st, 2nd and 3rd term grades and the midyear exam. Final grades were included in the student's weighted GPA.

Fall 2020-April 2021: The year started in full remote mode and then transitioned to in-person classes in a hybrid format. Students attended school in cohorts with 2 in-person days and 3 remote days. This included synchronous and asynchronous learning. Sports and activities resumed on a limited basis.

April 2021: Students returned to school, in-person, full time.

Community: Lynnfield, a suburban town of approximately 13,000 is located 12 miles north of Boston, MA at the junction of routes 1 and 128. The population is comprised primarily of professionals and business people who are deeply committed to supporting quality education.

Grade Point Average (GPA): LHS uses a weighted GPA system. All courses (including PE) are included. The GPA is calculated by assigning a numerical value to each letter mark and then deriving an average from those numerical equivalents. GPA will be calculated including grades from all courses with the number of attempted credits as the base. LHS only reports a weighted GPA

Rank in Class: Official rank in class is issued on or about October 1 of the student's senior year. This number is calculated with the 6th semester cumulative GPA. Students who have not attended LHS for 6 consecutive semesters will not have an official rank in class.

Instructional Levels

Advanced Placement (AP): Designed for students who excel in a subject and have demonstrated exceptional ability and motivation to do advanced level work. Students are required to have a teacher recommendation, a review of past performance, and/or testing to be placed in AP classes. Students are also required to take the College Board AP exam at the end of the course.

Honors: (H) Designed for students with very strong academic ability, motivation and study skills. Students must have a teacher recommendation, review of past performance, and/or testing to be placed in Honors level classes.

College Preparatory: (CP) Designated for students with solid academic ability and are planning to pursue post-secondary education.

Virtual High School (VHS) Online courses are available through Virtual High School Global Consortium (VHS). The intent of offering online classes is to supplement our Program of Studies with unique opportunities that may not be offered at LHS. Classes typically run for one semester. Students who are interested must receive administrative approval. Online classes will receive credit only. A grade will be recorded on the student's transcript but will not be calculated into the GPA/class rank.

Accreditation and Membership: LHS is fully accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). LHS holds membership in the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC), the New England Association for College Admission Counseling (NEACAC), and the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association (MIAA).
