**1. Senior Planning Night: Tuesday, September 28th:** During this evening, the counselors will offer tips and suggestions for the seniors' post-high school planning process. We will also cover the LHS protocol for sending transcripts and letters of recommendation. Additionally, we'll discuss applications, campus visits and standardized testing.

**2. Freshman Planning Night: Wednesday, September 29th:** This evening provides 9th grade parents/guardians with the opportunity to meet the counselor their child will have for their 4-year high school career. It will also provide an opportunity to discuss the important issues concerning the transition to high school that have emerged during the first quarter of the year. During this program, time will be given to a thorough explanation of all Lynnfield High School graduation requirements.

**3. Financial Aid Night: Tuesday, October 5th:** Marcia Toomey, Dean of Financial Aid at Endicott College will provide current information on the financial aid process. She'll cover topics including using the FAFSA, applying for scholarships and other tips for seeking financial assistance at the college level.

**4. Junior Planning Night Tuesday: February 1st :** A "must attend" for any family who will be experiencing the post-high school planning process for the first time with their juniors. This evening is loaded with important information and "insider tips" about what lies ahead in the process.

**5. Sophomore Planning Night: Tuesday, March 8th:** During this meeting, we'll discuss the Scoir program that the counselors will introduce to sophomores over the course of the month. In addition, we'll talk about beginning the process of post-high school planning.

**6. College Rep Panel Night: Tuesday, May 10th:** Admissions representatives from area schools will share their insights on the college admissions process. We'll discuss national trends, how the pandemic is impacting their schools as well as strategies and tips for the application process in general.
